Minutes of the 1998 AGM had been circulated, were taken as read, and signed as a true record.

- Treasurer's Report: Richard first pointed out that a new Stock in Hand list had been added to 4. the financial statement, as requested by the last meeting, but that making a meaningful valuation of music etc would be very difficult, so he felt it should in future appear just as a list for reference, and as a reminder to members. The overall position on concerts had been somewhat healthier this year, especially due to a much lower loss on the Annual Concert, and so we need to see in future that the Annual Concert is not a drain on our funds. The total from subs and patrons' fee was up about £100 on last year, but he felt the at subs should be increased by £1 all round. Having bought some new music this year, something we must continue to do, Richard felt it was a more typical year for the Choir financially. J Curtis informed members that the Ladies' Committee had decided that now that their major work for the 50th anniversary was over, they should close their account, and donate the money to choir funds. B Martindale said the ladies must be thanked for all their work. All agreed. J Curtis moved the Choir should accept the Treasurer's Report,
- Auditors' Report: W Berry said that as his first time in checking the books he had found it 5. quite easy to go through everything, and that Richard had done a very good job.
- Roll Secretary's Report: Neil informed members this was his twentieth year doing the register, 6. and he talked about how Choir membership had varied over that time. We now have 34 members, with two more possibles, but once again we have no pianist. 1st Tenor: 7, 2nd Tenor:

Lindon thanked Neil for his report, and said it was, as usual, most entertaining

- 7. Conductor's Report: Clare once again said she could hardly believe another year had passed. We seemed to have been busier this year, having learned seven new pieces, which did well for Choir morale, and all members seemed happier, although we were once again a littlle unsure, having no pianist. Lindon asked about concerts, and were we overpricing them. He felt we could do more 50:50 concerts. J Curtis felt we had to strike a happy medium, and that in booking concerts much must be left to the Secretary's discretion. Phil pointed out that if someone wanting a concert, and was unsure of our usual fee, he would always suggest alternatives, ie 50:50 or concerts for a donation, as well as full charity concerts. Clare said we should always seek more concerts, and she wouldn't mind if they were all charity concerts. J Curtis offered thanks to Clare for all the effort she had put in, seconded N Middlemas, and all agreed.
- Secretary's Report: Phil first informed members that from his point of view it was another good 8. year, and he had enjoyed the work as secretary as he always had the support and help of members. He felt the Committee would agree that this year we had good meetings, always with a quorum, and had some good discussions. He therefore thanked the whole committee for all their time, especially as they had had one or two problems. First ther was the most sad loss of Charlie Buckley, so he thanked Lindon for agreeing to step straight up as Chairman, and to Ken Tilly for



agreeing to be Vice-Chairman from that date. Then recently they had had the absence of Lindon and Bryan Martindale due to hospital, so he was very pleased to have them with us again. He offered special thanks to B Martindale and J Curtis for having completed their two years as committee members, and he trusted members would provide replacements. J Curtis offered thanks to the Secretary for all his work. All agreed.

9. Chairman's Remarks: Lindon said he wished more people would turn up for practices. He also spoke about minibuses. Last time he arranged one only half of the people who put their names down turned up, so the balance had to come for choir funds. He thought if people put their names down, they should pay for the seat even if they did not turn up.

10. Election of Officers:

Vice- Chairman: K Tilly elected, Treasurer: R Wood to continue, Secretary: P Rosser to continue, Roll Sec: N Scott to continue, Auditor: W Berry to continue, Librarians: L Mill, W Jopling, N Scott, W Berry to continue, Committee: P Dean, N Watson elected

- 11. Annual Subs: Treasurer had proposed to Committee to increase subs by £1 all round, and Committee had agreed. B Burn proposed increase accepted, seconded N Middlemas and carried. G McKillup asked if we still each paid £1 to Elemore Community Assoc. Richard said yes.
- 12. Patron's Fee: Committee recommended this should stay at £5. All agreed.
- 13. AOB: (i) J Whitfield asked about search for pianist. W Berry said he had two people to chase up. J Curtis to put something in the Echo.
 - (ii) B Burn wondered if there would be any advantage in the Choir becoming a registered charity. Richard could not see any advantage. B Martindale said he thought, from experience, that it would not be possible. A Hood felt this should be approached with caution, as we would have to have our books audited from outside. Money from the Lottery fund etc was mentioned. Phil informed members that for the Lottery fund we would have to say exactly what we wanted to spend the money on, ie not just 'music', but exactly how many copies of which pieces. A Hood mentioned the E Durham Regeneration Fund. Things were discussed for some time, then Richard suggested Committee look into this.
 - (iii) G McKillup pointed out that starting time of practice had slipped to 7.30 again. L Mill felt it was another example of lack of discipline. At Clare's suggestion Choir agreed for a trial period to start at 7.15, and sing straight through to 9 o'clock, without a break in the middle, then finish.

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Minutes of Annual General Meeting held on Friday 6 February 1998 at 7.30pm

1. Chairman: N Middlemas Members 27 (Later 30)

2. Apologies: B Martindale, T Grey (senior), Harry Guilford, J Whitfield, K Wilkinson, N Midgeley

- Minutes of the 1997 AGM had been circulated, were taken as read, and signed as a true record.
- 4. Treasurer's Report: The balance sheet had been criculated. Richard explained the apparent increase in funds was due to payments into the Friends of Lyons account from remains of German Travel and 200-club. We had actually suffered a loss in capital of over £1000 this year. £3855 are now our only financial assets, and unless we increase our income and/or reduce expenditure, it will not take long to disappear. He pointed out that since five years ago money from subs, patrons and grants had all reduced quite a lot, as had money from concerts. The Committee had made efforts to reverse the trend of large financial losses from the Annual Concert, but we need to concentrate our minds in getting all our finances onto a sound footing before time runs out. We need a basic annual income of about £1460 just to get by. Neville thanked Richard for being so conscientious in producing his report. All agreed.

J Curtis suggested all members and their wives becoming patrons. A member pointed out this would be like adding £5 to subs. Jack said it was only an idea for members to consider, and he was not suggesting it should be compulsory.

- 5. Auditors' Report: P Coade had examined all the books, and found everything in good order. He also received thanks from Neville for his conscientiousness.
- Roll Secretary's Report: With two new recruits, we now have 38 singers, and a new pianist. 1st Tenor: 6, 2nd Tenor: 8, Baritone: 13, Bass: 11
 There were 42 practices. Highest Section Attendances:
 1stTenor: L Lamb 42, H Ramshaw,H Hall 38, 2Tenor: M Lewins 37, B Hadfield,G McKillup 36
 Baritone: W Jobling 40,H Morton 38, Bass: R Jenner,J Curtis 42,C Buckley 38
 Concerts, 10, Highest Attendance 31, Annual Concert, Best Practice Attendance 35.
- Sick Visitors' Report: H Hall having retired, J McElroy now on his own would welcome help.
- 8. Conductor's Report: Clare could hardly believe a year had passed since she had joined the Choir as deputy pianist and conductor. She felt the concerts we had arranged had been very good for choir morale, as it is good to have something to aim for all the time. It looks as though we might have a busier year with concerts in 1998. P Coade said we must thank Clare for all she had done for the Choir this year. All agreed.

He once again emphasized the year had gone well because the Choir had provided all the people needed for Committee to do its job, and he trusted they would once again fill all the vacancies. He also mentioned he felt the Choir had recovered its enthusiasm for singing, for which we had to thank our conductor. All agreed.
- 10. Induction of New Chairman: Neville first explained he felt he had to step down a year early because he could not fulfil all his responsibilities as Chairman because of his wife's health, and the

time he needed to care for Maureen. He said he had enjoyed being Chairman, and repeated how the morale had returned to the Choir, for which we must thank Clare. We must also thank Edmund for all his help on the piano, but we now gladly accepted Ray as pianist. He then invited Charlie Buckley to take over.

P Coade suggested a change of venue, at least in future years. This was discussed for some time, and Charlie suggested it was food for thought for the next Committee Meeting.

Minutes of the 1996 AGM had been circulated. They were taken as read, and signed as a true 3. record.

4. Matters Arising:

- Treasurer's Report: The balance sheet had been circulated. Richard explained that this year the 5. Choir balance had fallen from £1700 to £500. He also told members that the Friends of Lyons MVC account now held £2554.07. - Sick Visitors' Report: H Morton and J Simpson especially visited. Only member not visited Don 8. Kay. This left to his friends.

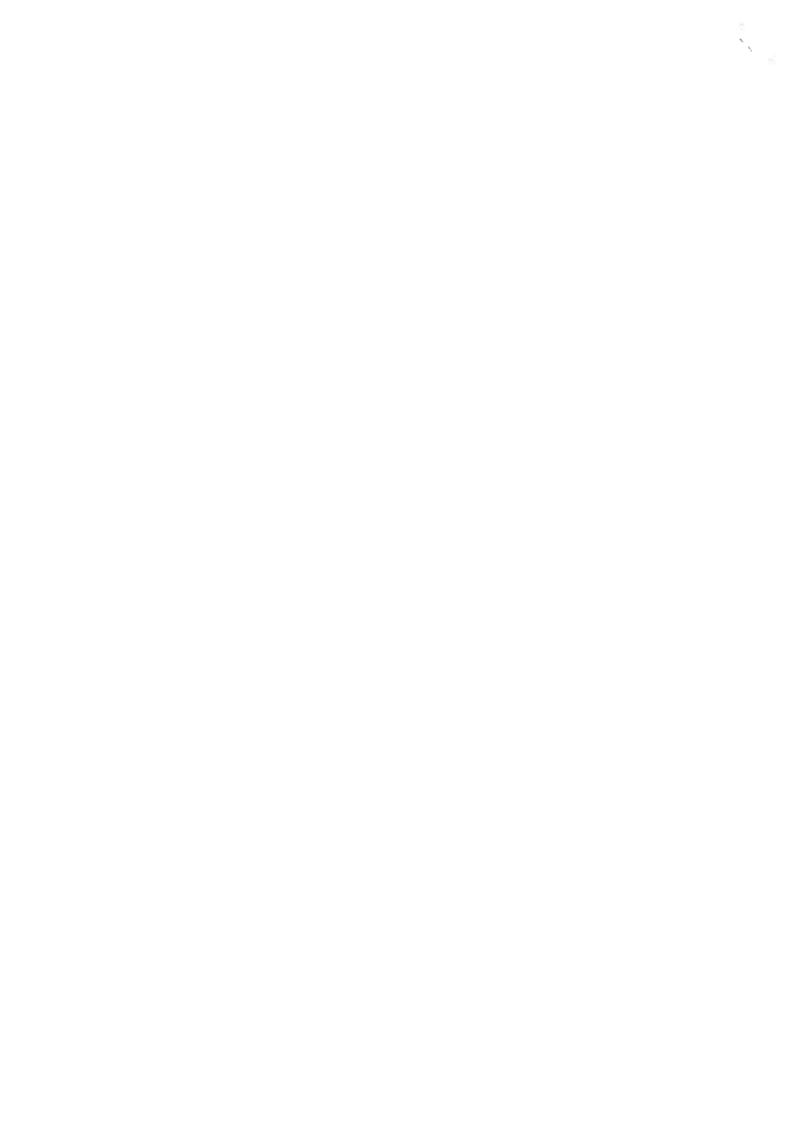
ii) L Lamb mentioned members who had not been to practices for some time. He asked should he continue to try to get their uniforms and music, and could anyone give him their addresses.
