COMMITTEE MEETING ON THURSDAY OCTOBER 28th 1982: AT 7:00p.m.: AT 37. SUMMERHILL, MIDDLE HERRINGTON. (Home of Mr. and Mrs. R. Pattison.)

CHAIRMAN: Mr. J. Huggins.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Massr's Bousfield, Kall, Kay, Middlemas, Pattieon, Settrey, Sanderson, Williams and Young.

APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE: were received from Mr. Colin Self.

MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING: were duly read, approved and signed as a true record.

MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES: were discussed as follows:-

1) Chairman read a letter from the President thanking the choir for their gifts to Mrs Bousfield and himself, and congratulating the choir on their recent win at Blackpool. Included with the letter was a denation chaque. Chairman thanked the President sincerely for his thanks, congratulations and donation adding that the former were really more important than the latter. He concluded with the assurance that the latter would be willingly read out at the next rehearsal.

2) Sec reported that some progress had been made in the quest for payment of fee from the Concert at Bishop Auckland Town Hall on July 18th, 1982. Sec informed committee that a had made a formal application for the chaque to be paid, and hoped that this would

oe forthcoming within a few days.

3) Sec reported confusion over the concert which was apparently for the Houghton Parish Church. He had reply from the above body stating that it was not they who had asked for the concert, so there was something of an impass at the moment, in that we have a concert date arranged and no approar. In mitigation he further added that during the telephone call he had asked the caller to write an official latter and this request had not been complied with. It was concluded that nothing could be done about this until the potential apensor contacted the Sec again.

4) Sec apologised to certain members for not supplying agendes for the present meeting due to the fact that he had exhausted his current supply of copying paper, and he wished

to discuss the factors of renewal of the same in A.O.B.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Treasurer reported a balance to date of £3020,17p this being derived from receipts of £7072.25p set against expenditure to date of £5276.10p. Monies being held as the date of the meeting in Current Account ... £1664.02p and Deposit Account £1356.15p. Treasurer pointed out that there are outstanding expenses from Blackpool of some £444.00p, so that the true balance to date should read.... £2576.17p. Treasurer reported that the grant of £150.00p from Tyne and Wear had been received, and w w a included in the above accounts. Some discussion took place on the amount of this grant, the concensus being that in this day and age this was a relatively small amount of grant aid, though no concrete proposels were agreed as to resedial actions on this point. It was pointed out that the choir funds were being considerably enhanced by donations coming in from the ladies committee, and the Treasurer expressed some concern that the choir was going to pay large amounts of this financial gains in Corporation Yax in the next financial year. It was therefore agreed that the ladies committee be approached with a view to they themselves investing their own funds for the moment in possibly a Building Society account. Chairman and Treasurer undertook to talk to the officers of the ladies committee on this matter. The Treasurer's report was unanimously accepted.

SOCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: Social Secretary gave a brief report stating that he has no desire to "flood the field" with social events at the moment especially since the ladies committee are busy organising social and fund raising events, so he feels that he is willing to let the ladies play their full part in this for the time being. He stated his willingness to organise a social event for early 1983, if so desired by the choir. He stated that the next social event as such would be the 'Pie and Pee Supper8 on Thursday, November 25th, at the Elemore Community Association. Social Secretary was thanked for his report which was unanimously accepted.

MUSICAL DIRECTOR'S REMARKS AND BENCKPOOL FESTIVAL COMMENTS: Mus. Dir. opened discussion by stating what a marvellous time he had experienced the previous Saturday at Blackpool, and stated how good it was to win the 'A' Section of the competition again after such a

. . .

lengthy interval of time. He felt that one of our main achievements in the competition was our ability to sing in eight parts and to acquire an acceptable balance of sound there by, and he added his personal feelings that by doing this so successfully, the chair had broken through quite a large musical barrier. He thanked every member of the chair for the wonderful support that he ,as Musical Director, had been given, both on the day of the competition and in the weeks beforehand during both nrowal and extra rehearsals. He stated that, on the day of the competition that choir was well disciplined and sang in a most confident fashion. It was his firm assertion now that Lyons is the North-East's second 'Premier' Choir along with Felling, and that we can now hold our own with the letter chair. Discussion followed on the more adverse aspects of the day, and here it was felt that the transport left something to be desired in terms if it's comfort and the prices charged. After discussion it issn agreed that for such events in future all transport would be put out to tender, and that the firms that we have used in the past be made aware of this new proceedure. Some criticism was made of the lack of procetics facilities within the Winter Gerdene for choirs needing to rehearse for the evening competition. It was also suggested that the publication of the test pieces for the succeeding year's competition might be brought forward, so that it be known at the end of the present competition, so to speak. Social Sec was given Isave to complete the N.A.C. Questionnaire on the Blackpool Festival, and was instructed as to the form his answe ? should take on certain issues and comments. The Musical Director them initiated a

Ingthy discussion on the Own Choice Piecs, basing his opinions on the fact that the choice of the Bruckner 'Ave Maria' had been a somewhat chancy one both technically, and in it's concept, but it had worked extremely well, had been very well received, and had undoubtedly played an important part in the winning of the competition. On this experience it was concluded that very careful consideration would have to be given to this matter in precession for future competitions, since, in future the own choice piece would have to be both imaginative, modern, and as good a contrast as could possibly be achieved. Chairman concluded the discussion on Blackpool by stating that he would allow some time for discussion of the competition in the interval at the next rehearsal.

On the matter of recording dates, the Musical Director asserted that we would have to make every effort to make two dates free for recording during Movember, and to this end it was agreed that Firday November 12th, and Friday November 19th be the said dates. Mus. Oir and hairman agreed to consult with Mr. Sowey over the proposal to transport a decent plane from the Hetton Primary School to the Elemons Community Centre for the two recording sessions.

Musical Director concluded his remarks by focussing attention forward to the proposed 'eratorio' performance scheduled for March 26th, 1983. It was egreed that Sec prepare pro-forma invitations for the ladies chair at the carlist opportunity, and distribute these among the various contacts in the Male Voice Choir, so that we could escertain as soon as possible when the remembersals etc could begin.

THE DEPUTY CONDUCTOR OF THE CHOIR: It was proposed seconded and unanimously agreed that Mr. TOM HALL be appointed forbinuith as the Deputy Conductor of the Chair, and that he else be appointed as one of the Deputy Accompanists along with Mr. PETER CRAWFORD.

THE CHOIR NEWSLETTER/ MAGAZINE: Sec reported that he had been approached by Mr. Curtis, on the subject of the chair magazine and had been asked to place this topic on the agenda for this meeting since he was originally seeking guldance as to the wishes of the choir committee in the light of recent comments and criticisms of a past issue of the mayazine that had been relayed to him. Sec reported that Mr. Curtis was udlling to continue his editorship of the magazine. Sec reported to committee that he had passed on the netice of this request to the Chairman. The Chairman had produced a document entitled the Duties for the Editor(s) of the Newslotter; as a possible solution to Mr. Curtis's quest for quidence, and that Mr Curtie, was already in possession of such a copy. Sec further reported that he had spoken again with Mr. Curtis on the matter of the document prepared by the Chairman, and as the result of this discussion, it was apparent that Mr. Curtis was in agreement with the main guidelines offered but sought futher clerification on two main points namely the fact that in guideline(1) he felt that if choir members were being asked to contribute erticles etc, then they would obviously express opinions from time to time, and that he, as editor, would feel that these opinions should be expressed so long as they complied with paragraph (a) of the guidalines, despite the fact that some of the opinions expressed eight not reflect current treeds of thought amongst the committee and officers of the choir, As a possible solution to this problem, Mr. Middlewas suggested that a disclaimer be included at the end of each successive issue of the magazine. He suggested that it should read.... "The opinions expressed by individuals in the Newslatter are not necessarily those of the Chair Committee". This proposal was seconded and subsequently agreed. Mr. Curtis also requested clerification of the sentence in brackets in paragraph (b) of the guidelines. It was proposed, seconded and agreed that there was a need to simplify this statements and that henceforth, it should read.... "Anything that is competent committee business, without prior approval of the committee" Sec stated his fears that this document be not interpreted as a direct 'job specification' and therfore it was agreed that the title of the document should now read "Guidelines For the Editors". COMPETITIONS IN 1983: Sec had previously produced a duplicated sheet with sallent details of specified competitions for 1983, and these were discussed at some length, and the following points were agreed:-

- That in the event of us not being accepted for the above competition, that we enter the Huddersfield (Mrs. Sunderland) Cheral Competition.
- (c) That we enter the Tynedale Musical Festival as a local festival.
- (d) That a raturn to the Blackgool Musical fastival in October 1983 be Not precluded at this stage, but that the possibility of doing so orhotherwise be left' on the tabbe.

FUTURE CONCERT: Sec informed committee of a request for a concert received from All Saints Church Eppleton, for the choir to perform thetre during the menth of April 1983. Sec was instructed to reply along the lines that we are singing in the locality in May 1983 on two occasions, and that we feel that in few of two other local commitments that are already booked, the church might commend a better audiebce in eay September 1983, and to suggest perhaps Saturday, September 24th. However, if April it must be then Sec was mandeted to offer Saturday April 30th 1983, at 7:00pm, and at a fee of £50,00p.

It was agreed that the choir accept this concert stating March 12th, 1983; as the containing the date, the concert to start at 7:00pm, and at a fee of £50.80p. Sec to reply to this request stating the date time fee etc.

ANNUAL CONCERT 1983. Chairman reported that he had spoken with Mr. Jones of the Rober Passa as Harmony, who had verbally put this request to the committee of the latter organization, to invite them to be ourquest artists for the 1983 concert. This had been discussed and passed at their recent committee meeting. Sec was instructed to write the formal latter of invitation as soon as possible, stating that this is the facilierocal concert from the one at Mankweermouth School.

BLACKPOOL FESTIVAL 1982: On the matter of transport for this festival Sec stated that some 70 people required coach transport altogether, and that he had booked one '53 seater coach only from Bleanch's Coaches. He further reported that he had managed some telephone concversation with Safari Loaches who had recommended a 25/29 seater coach rather than a mini-bus for this trip, but he had not been able to secure further details. Treasurer undertook to find out the details from the above coach company. The selection of the 'Own Choice' piece for this competition was again discussed. Mus Dir stated his preference for 'Ave Maria' (Bruckner) with possible alternatives being either 'Salt Geef' or 'Music When Soft Voices Die'. After discussion, it was agreed that the 'Own Choice' be 'Ave Marla'. Possible arrangements of the choir to perform this piace were discussed, plus the splitting of the singers into the two choirs necessary. It was agreed that Mus Dir. select and place the choir(s) so as to achieve the best possible affect from this music. The potential problem of the timing of the departure from Blackpool was discussed, though no firm decision was taken on the matter at this meeting.

THE CHOIR ROLL: Sec informed committee of the resignation from the choir plus the return of choir music and the from Mr. David Robson(BassII), due to the fact that he has recently gained promotion in his work and is shortly to move to Thronaby. This resignation was accepted with regret, les being instructed to write thus to Ar. Robson. Prior to this resignation the choir numbers were.... TenorI 16 Tenor II 14 Basel 19 making a total choir membership of 66. He reported that notable low attendances in the past 3 months were from J. Maughan Tenor I (3), P. Williams Tenor II (0) though it was stated that since he has now returned to Wales and has returned music ste, this is now a resignation in effect, J. Davies Bass I (0) and J. Thompson Base II (8). Sec was instructed to Urite to Mr. Davies to ask him to declare his intentions tourds him membership of the choir. Sec further reported that John Whitfield Tenor I would have completed his probationary period by the next rehearsal. It was agreed that he be accepted into full choir membership. Some discussion took place over his son Jon Whitfield and the fact that his voice has not yet fully matured. It was agreed that he also be accepted into full membership of the choir, but that a careful watch be put on him until his voice settles and to move him from section to section as his voice development demands. The return to the chair of Mr. W. Macdonald was noted.

GERMAN EXCHANGE VISIT: Chairman and Mr. Middlemas reported on sub-committee deliberations concerning the entertainment of the German Party in 1983. The German chair had expressed a desirs to visit York and Edinburgh, and committee though the former would be a good place to visit in the Autumn, but had serious doubts about the suitability of the latter at this time of year. Mr. Middlemas reported on a conect made with the manager of the Eldon Square Complex in Newcastle, and stated the possibility of having the party thouse round the complex, of having coffee provided, and then allowing the party to show in the complex. Other ideas for visits were briefly discussed, though, from the initial contracts made the problems of size of party and hospitality loom large, with the possibility of the group having to be split in two for certain visitsets. Social See again made the point that evening materialment in local halls would have to be booked soon. Committee agreed to suggest to the sub-committee that the official welcoming reception take place at Murton Velfare Hall on the evening of Monday Oct 10th, 1983, that the concert is Nation Church be on Friday Oct 14th, 1983, with a party to follow the concert at the Element Community Assin Hall in Easington Lane, with the possibility of the visit to Eldon Square and Newcastle on the morning and afternoon of the firday as well.

THE CHOIR MAGAZINE: Chairman started discussion on this topic by asking committee members to consider the purpose of the publication, and stated that, since the publication is officially described as a 'Newsletter', it should be used to inform the people who read it and to publicise the activities of the choir. Discussion followed, and there was general agreement on these stated aims. It was also unanimously agreed that 'tife' with the Lyons' should continue as a choir project. It was stated that certain complaints had been received concerning the fect that articles produced for publication prior to the German Visit had not been used, since the publication date had been delayed until after the trip, also that no member of the tour sub committee had been asked' to write any retrospective views etc concerning the German tour. It was also the opinion of many committee members that certain comments and opinions made in the most recent edition of the Newsletter had extended beyond the normal bounds of editorial comment. Committee, acrosed that Chairman speak privately with the Co-editors of the Newsletter.

to pass on the feelings of committee that the Newsletter should not be a publication for editorial comment, and to respectfully point out that there is in existence a machinery for complaints about the running of the affairs of the choir through the committee. This the Chairman agreed to do. Further discussion was terminated at this point by the Chairman.

A.O.A: Some discussion took place on the fact that some choir members had given their choir lapel badges away whilst in Germany, to their hosts. It was agreed that choir members who had done this, be asked to replace their lapel badge at their own expense, at the earliest opportunity. Treasurer informed committee that he had a supply of the lapel badges sufficient to replace the donated badges. It was also agreed that the lapel badges of the German Choir, should not be regarded as part of the official uniform of Lyons Mele Voice Choir, and shall therefore not be worn on the choir uniform at any official choir functions. Chairman agreed to inform choir of these points at the next rehearsal.

TIME AND PLACE OF NEXT COMMITTEE MEETING: It was agreed that the next committee meeting take place on Thursday, September 16th, 1982, at 7:00p.m., at 13, All Saints Drive, Church Road, Metton-Le-Hole, (Mr.and Mrs. F. Williams.)

MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING: were duly read approved and signed. ..

MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES: Chairman stated that as far as he could see all the mattern outstanding from previous minutes had been catered for in the present agenda. He stated that he wished to place on the official record of the choir his thanks and appreciation to Messr's Howey and Middlemas, for their sterling work for the German Exchange visit, both in the palnning and organisation stages prior to the tour, and for their day to day arrangements during the duration of the exchange visit.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Treasurer reported a present balance of £1971.49p this being derived from receipts of £6353.90p set against expenditure of £4382.41p. Monies et present being held as per Current A/c.... £677.81p and Deposit A/c....£1293.68p. Treasurer stated that as of this date no Grant forms had been received from Tyne and West Co. Council. Sec stated that he had telephoned concerning these and had been assured that they would be forwarded immediately, and should therefore be expected shortly. He reported a profit from the recent Annual Concert of £86.00p, though her expressed concern that there was still some ticket money outstanding. He further reported that the Garman trip had cost the choir some £864.00s thus far, though the above balance did include a Grant sum of £168.00p from Durham Co, Council. He explsined that the largest single cost item had been the purchase of the presentation plates, of which 76 had been purchased originally at a cost of £722.00p. Of these 8 had been broken in transit, and application for replacement had been refused. In addition a further 14 plates had been purchased at a cost of £135.00p. Some 7 plates had been presented on the tour, and a further 42 had been purchased by chair members. These latter had been subsidised by choir funds at £4.50p per plate, the remainder. being sold to choir members at £9.00p each. The Treasurer estimated that the total cost of the plates to choir funds had been £278.00p. The Treasurer was thanked for his report which was unanimously accepted.

SOCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: Owing to the late arrival of the Social Secretary to the meeting it was agreed that this topic be deferred to the next meeting.

FUTURE RECORDING: Mus Dir opened the discussion by soliciting the opinions of committee members as to the desirability of going ahead and producing another record to be published in the Spring of 1983. There was general agreement in committee that this was indeed desirable, and Mus. Dir. stressed therefore the need to start taping : pieces at the sarliest opportunity, the dates for the first recording sessions bei agreed. Some discussion took place on the mechanisms of financing the initial capital: outaly for the pressing and purchase of the record, in view of the money being needed to finance the German choir's visit during 1983. It was agreed that the Chairman approach the impulse Organisation to ascertain current prices on 500,750 and 1000 copies of records, yet it was also agreed that no decision to produce the record be taken at this meeting, though Mus Dir was given a firm mandate to proceed with the making of the 'Master Tape'. It was agreed that recoding session be held on Buly 2 nd. and Duly 9th. With Duly 23rd being potentially agreed as the Film and Slide Night from the German Tour, given that Sec found out the availability of a Hall for that partic lar evening. Mus. Dir gave an outline of the pieces that he had selected for the master tape. Discussion took place on these suggested pieces and various amendments and further suggestions were made.

ANNUAL CONCERT 1983: Sec reported on his lack of progress in being able to book and of the artists that he was instructed to enquire about at a previous meeting. Some discussion took place on this matter and it was agreed that Sec ring London to find any answer that he could as to the availability and fees of the verious artists. Further discussion took place on possible alternatives, Mus Dir offering a series of alternative singers who appeared in the current catalogues mainly on a 'F.O.A.' basis. Another possible alternative was to hire the winner of the 'Young Musician of the the singers who appeared in the current catalogues mainly on a 'F.O.A.' basis.

Competition. Chairman suggested that another alternative would be to invite the Roker Peers of Harmony as guest artists. These various alternatives were discussed, but is was agreed that no decision would be taken until the Sec could provide some definite information concerning the London Artists.

CITY HALL CONCERT 1983 WITH ADDISON M.V.C. AND ANNFIELD PLAIN GLEEMEN: Mus. Dir. reported that he had rece yit been contacted by telephone by Norman Whitfield of Addison Chair to ascertain if Lyons M.V.C. would be willing to take part in another concert with the other two choirs on a Saturday during November 1983. Mus. Bir. had re-iterated the mandate given him by committee that Lyons N.V.C. were "for" the concert in principle but would not be willing to have the J.S.V.B. as guesta again, on the basis that we had worked so much with this group in recent years, we felt it was time for a change. Mr. Whitfield had stated that his chair wished to do the concert with 3.5.V.8., and Ar. Kay stated that he would bring the offer to committee for it's discussion and decision. Discussion duly did take place and committee re-affigued itte previous mandate that we do not wish to take part in the concert with the J.S.V.C. but Mus. Dir. was amndated to state that, if the other two choirs wished to proceed on this basis, then they go shead with our good grace but without us. Mus. Dir. suggested that it would be right and proper for Lyons Choir to offer monurate alternative suggestions to Mr. Whitfield. It was agreed that Mus. Dir. offer the following alternatives..

- (a) A singer of International repute eg.... Kiri Tekanawa
- (b) An organ concert similar to our recent Annual Concert.
- (c) The Kings Singers
- (d) Jon Williams and Skys

BLACKPOOL FESTIVAL OCTOBER 23rd,1982: Sec stated the need for discussion on this topic, especially re-transport, since he had placed a firs booking on 1 coach and had placed an option on another, and had promised that this option would either be taken up or dropped by July. He outlined the facts that some 69 people required coach transport, which was too many for one coach, but at these figures a second coach was not viable. It was agreed after discussion that Sec drop the option on the second coach, but to make enquiries with Bleanch's coaches as to the possibility of hiring a Mini-coach to take the people who were at present 'surplus'. Sec outlined the fact that there were some 53 choristers who had thus far signed up to go, these breaking coun into T(1) 14....T(II) 18....B(I) 15.... and B(II) 13, though it was stated that several choristers and not yet signed. Mus. Dir stated that he would wary such like to take 60 choristers onto the stand for the competition, so Sec was instructed to see the remaining choir members as soon as possible to find out if they wished to go or not.

MUSICAL FESTIVALS IN 1983: Sec reported on his findings from the A Festivela that he had been instructed to contect from the previous meeting. These results were as follows.....

CARLISLE: Do run a Male Voice Section, but usually small entries 2 or 3 but only 1 in

HULL: Do not run a M.V. Class any wors dur to lack of entries.

MUDDERSFIELD: Do run a M.V. Class and that they can attract around 6 entries per year.
EDINBURGH: Do run a M.V. Class but have only had small (2-3) entries in last 2 years.

It was agreed that out of the above, the latter 2 looked the most promising. See was instructed to write to Edinburgh and Mudderfield for the Syllabi.

Film and Slides evening on July 23rd. It was agreed that Chairman eak choir members to submit their slides etc as soon as possible, these to be edited and made into a programme by an agreed sub-committee made up of Mesar's Bowey, Huggins, Middlemas and Hadifield. It was suggested and agreed that the tape made of one of the concerts in Sermany owned by Mr. Nixon should be borrowed and palyed during the film show. It was stated that the only points of criticism concerning the tour that could be made was from the English cf., the German side, with the comfort and lack of sir-conditioning of the coaches being centioned and commented upon, plus the choice and number of

stops on the journey. The Chairman suggested that in future, the chair should perhaps not be so hide bound by costs when choosing it's routes and modes of transport.

PRE-PUBLICITY FOR THE GERMAN TOUR: sec reported that, on the night before the party left for the tour to Germany, and after the announcement to the choir that a photographer from the Durham Chronicle would be taking photos of the departure of the party, he was approached by Mr. Curtis, who reported that, on hearing the announcement, Mr. Anthony Modgson had expressed burt and extreme disappointment that a photographer from his paper the Sunderland and Washington Times had not been asked to attend... all this in the light of the work and publicity given to the choir by Mr. Hadgson in his lob as a staff reported for the latter paper. Mr. Curtis expressly asked that this matter be brought to the attention of the choir committeer at the earliest opportunity. The Chairean stated that to the best knowledge of the committee and the sub-committee no 'arrangements or invitations had been sent to any newspaper, and that the projo grapher from the Durham Chronicle had appeared entirely on hai oun initiative. From ... this point the discussion broadened out to the publicity need and the need to start making detailed arrangements for the return visit of the German Choir, during the week of DCTOBER 9th-16th 1983. It was proposed and agreed that the same sub-committee as handled the outward arrangements, be kept in office to continue the planning and arranging for the return trip, this committee being empowered to co-opt other chair members as and when it is deemed necessary. This sub-committee was instructed to draw up a plan of action and possible activities/visite etc for the return trip as even as possible. They were also instructed to explore the possibility of asking local firms eg... C.M. Pearson and Sons for some sponsorahip for the tour.

A 'PERMANENT HOME'FOR THE CHOIR: Sec reported that on the day the choir left for the German Tour, he had been approached by Mr. Curtis who asked that the submission be out to the chair that the committee look into the possibility of purchasing the former Methodist Chapel (Next to the Church Hall in Hetton) as a possible rehearsal end social centre for the choir. Mr. Hell stated that this particular building is shortly to be converted into offices and therefore, as he understood it the building was already sold or leased. Discussion followed, with the Chairman broadening the discussion by stating that this was a 'hobby-horse' that had been ridden many times in the past by former committees, and added his oun personal opinion that, as a long term objective. the chair should look for such a permanent base from which to operate. Other combers of committee voiced their objections to such an aim on the grounds of excessive drain on funds in maintaining a building, and some members questioned it's viability in terms of the fact that since the choir so so spread, would it be supported by even the choir members beamselves? It was agreed that the committee attempt to plumb the feelings of the choir in this respect, by writing two articles for the Christmas edition of the choiur magazine one(to be written by the Chairman) in favour of this projected aim, the other(to be written by Mr. Pattison) against the projected aim, thereby using the magazine as a 'forum' to catal se the opinions of the choir membership.

A.C.B.: See conveyed a request from the Hetton Methodist Church for a concert on any Wednesdey evening in May 1983, as part of the 125th Anniversary Celebrations of the Church. It was agreed that the choir accept this concert offering Wednesdey May 25th, 1983 as the most suitable date. Discussion took place on the fee to be charged for this concert. It was finally agreed that the choir charge a fee of £25.00p, though Sec to state in his letter to the Chapel that the normal fee is £50.00p.

Discussion took place on a concert request for the Seahem Masonic Gardening Ase'n in September 1982. It was agreed that Sec write to this association thanking them for the request, but declining the concert on the grounds that the Masonic Hall in Seahem is as small that the choir would literally drown the audience, and that the policy of not splitting the choir is still to be maintained. Chairman asked if there had been reply by W. Macdonald to the letter sent by Sec in March. Sec replied in the negative, and read out ther original letter that he had sent. It was agreed that Sec write to Ar. Macdonald again to ask him what his intentions towards the choir are and are to be in future

Time AND PLACE OF NEXT MEETING: Agreed that the next committee meeting take place on Thursday, July 15th, 1982; at 7:00p.m. at 19, See View Park, Whitburn...(home of Mr. and Mrs., N.U. Middlemas).

TREASURER'S REPORT: Treasurer reported a balance of £2999.81p, this being derived from receipts of £3007.82p set against expenditure amounting to £287.21p. Monies being held at this date as follows.... Current A/c £1923.70p and Deposit A/c £1076.11p. Incl In this balance is £580.00p as deposits for German Tour, making a real balance of £2419.81p. The patrons list continues to improve, to date 70 persons have become patrons and have cost ributed £116.50p. It was expected that further patrons fees would be forthcoming. Trees, was thanked for his report which was accepted unanimously.

SOCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: With reference to the Social Eveneing on April 29th, 1902, 300.

Sec reported that all bookings for Hall, meal etc were now confirmed, that tickets were now in circulation for this function. It was agreed after discussion that this function we made into a 'Femily Night' and that tickets for children of members and friends be asid at half price. Social Sec initiated discussion on his idea of inviting members of the phair who have been forced to leave the choir through no fault of thier own, to this function, is the guests of the choir. Discussion took place around this point and it was finally agreed that Soc Sec send complimentary tickets to the following.... Chairman of Hetton—1. Town Council and Wife, Mr. and Mrs. Balmer, Mr. and Mrs A. Shields, Mr. and Mrs Jake Hall, Mr. and Mrs Joe Paxton, Mr. J. Maughan, and Mrs Sharp.

THE CHOIR ROLL: Sec apologised to members for having forgotten the choir roll book, second full discussion on the choir roll had to be shifted to the agenda for the April Meeting. Discussion did take place on the attendance of certain members, Sec being instructed to write to Mr. W. Mecdonald (Massl) expressing the concern of committee for his lack of attendance during 1982. Chairman agreed to see Messr's Brown and Coade, to ask that they see to the return of the music of the new member they brought with them who has now, apparently left the chair. Any further discussion was curtailed until the next committee meeting when the full statistics would be made available, hopefully!

ENERAL POLICY RE-MIXED VOICE PERFORMANCES: Mus. Dir. opened discussion on this topic, by expressing his hope that an augmented choir could possibly perform the 'Requiem' by faure plus another complimentary work sung in English, around Easter time 1983; though in the light of the financial loss and the lack of support from a fair proportion of the choir members, for the 1981 performance of 'Messiah' he earnestly sought the views of committee members on the prospects for such a performance coming to fruition. Lengthy discussion took place on this topic and several members expressed their views freely. Mr. Pattison was very much in favour of such a performance going ahead, and suggested that a mixed choir be formed as a separate unit. Other members felt that this would prove detrimental to Lyons Male Voice Choir for it might provide divided loyalties in the second a mixed performance with an already existing ladies choir in the region viz...

Low Fell Ladies Choir, or the Middleton Singers. Another idea was to organise the choir for such a performance on a purely invitation basis for both Lyons Choir members and lady singers, rather than to expect all the chair members to support the venture. Chairman cunmed up the discussion by stating that the majority of the committee felt in favour of another mixed voice preformance, and it was apparent that Easter 1983, would not only be the ideal time, it might be the only feasible time in 1983, and that the performance should be based on the Lyons Male Voice Choir providing the male chorus, and an invited ladies chorus be again assembled

COMPETITION COMMITMENTS FOR 1982: Sec and Soc Sec reported that they had received two lists of available Fest [vals for 1983, which amounted to over 200 altogether, but that these lists had just recently arrived and therefore meither had had time to assimilate this bulk of information. It was therefore agreed to place this topic on the agenda for the April Committee meeting. It was, however stated that the information provided, only gave information on choral classes and did not specify if the festival held specific Male Voice Classes. It was also though desirable to discover which of the listed festivals attracted large Male Voice Entries, so as to give good compétition. Soc Sec ans Sec agreed to write to N.A.C. and Nat Assoc'n of Music Festivals respectively, to try to provide answers to these questions for the next committee meeting.

ANUAL CONCERT 1983: Sec asked committee to think about possible artistes for the 1983 nual Concert since, if they wished to book a London Artiste, then plans had to be set in motion within the next few weeks. Mus Dir. floated the idea of using the 'Roker Peers' as our guests for the 1983 Annual Concert, but stated that he wished to reserve judgement on this suggestion until after the forthcoming concert with that particular group. Further discussion took place on possible artistes, and Sec was instructed to write to the various agencies to enquire as to the availability and fees of the following..... Thomas Allen, Kiri Tekanawa, Stuart Burrows, Isobel Buchanan, Moira Anderson.

ANNUAL CONCERT 1982: Sec reported several items on this topic as follows:-

- 1. Tickets for the concert would be available from printers on Mar. 19th, but posters would be another week.
- 2. Re- V.I.P. invitations a reply had been received from Chairman of D.C.C. who would attend the concert.
- 3. Sec asked permission to arrange complimentary tickets for Mr. R. Mills and David Sparrow, as a token of our appreciation for their kindness and help in retreiving the Treasurer's papers on the day his house was broken into, This request was granted.
- 4. Chairman reported that arrangements for the movement of piano and staging from Hetton Primary School, had been made and would be attended to by Mr. Bowey.
- 2. Sec reported that he had written to the artistes asking for their programme for the concert, but, as yet, no replies were forthcoming.

GERMAN EXCHANGE VISITE Mr. Middlemus reported that bookings had been made for some 76 participants in the trip, this being made up of 40 chorists 8(Tenor I) 8(Tenor II) 12(Bass I) 12(Bass II) plus M.D. and Accompanist, and 36 extra passengers. 1982 tarrifs are not yet fixed but should be known after April 1st 1982. Insurance had been taken out for everyone going on the trip except Mr. Don Race who was anking his own arrangements in this respect. To reported that none 76 plates had been ordered, plus 30 extra orders, plus a further I for presentation purposes while in Germany. Since we are ordering less than the quoted figure the price per plate had now gone up to £8.00p. Mr. Middlemas reported that he had been in contact with Mr. Henshaw who is in the process of finishing his current print of Durham, and that he had ordered 1 large print, plus 5 smaller prints all for presentation purposes on the last. Discussion took place on the status of Mr. Ritson, in terms of him purchasing a place, and in this respect, it was agreed that he be included for the D.C.E. subsidy shorm out.

THE POSITION OF SECURY CO WICTOR: Chairman introduced discussion on this topic from the Annual General Meeting, by metlining previous discussion that had taken place on this topic lastegoer, and re-stated the desire of the chair committee to seek a deputy conductor from outside the chair membership. Discussion followed on the criteria for a deputy conductor, and the following points were agreed. 'The deputy Conductor shall....

a) not be offered an longurarium.

b) be asked to join the choir as a member.

c) he given rest in places to reahearse, and be incouraged to conduct the pieces he rehearnes at concerts where and whom they are included in the programme.

official positions withing the choir, until the September Committee meeting.

Mus. Bir reported that he had held conversation with Mr. Tom Hall, on this subject, and that he had refused the offer of the position, due to health reasons and lack of time. On the suggestion from the A.G.M. of Mr. Joe Firker, it was stated that his wife is very ill and therefore, although he is now a retired person, he would also be very unlikely to accept the position. Similarily, Mus Dir. reported that he had also tentatively approached Mr. Walter Robinson, but for family reasons he had also declined the offer. CHAIRMAN: Mr. J. Huggins.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Messrs Kay, Middlemas, Pattison, Sanderson, Self, Settrey, Williams, Young.

APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE: from Measure Bounfield and Hall.

MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETINGS: were duly read, approved and signed.

MATTERS ARISING: Several matters from the minutes were taken as follows:-

- Sec reported that the order for chair photographs was now complete, these would be distributed as soon as possible from the next rehearsal.
- 2. Sec. reported that the new supply of choir letterheads had been done.
- 3. Sec reported that letter to N.A.C. regarding competitions had been sent, but, on looking back through previous correspondence, it was clear that this was not published of until March each year anyway.
- 4. Sec reported that he had not yet ordered the Music Year book since he did not know the publisher. The volume would be ordered when this was known.
- 5. Sec reported that confirmation of the start time of the concert for Hetton Comm. Ass'n on April 14th was now to hand. This was to be 7:45pm.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Treasurer reported a current balance of £2265.92p, this being derived from receipts of £235 .52p set against expenditure of £23 .60p. Monies being held as follows... Eurrent A/c £189 .81p and Deposit A/c £1974 .11p. Treasurer pointed out that included in the balance was the sum of £158 .50p in cheques and cash that had been stolen from his home during a recent break in at his house. He went on to state that the cheques had all been duly stopped at the banks concerned, and that he was endeavouring to claim back the cash on his own personal house contents insurance policy, though, in this resepect he was experiencing certain difficulties with the Insurance Company concerned. He reported that he had arranged the use of a night-safe bag with the bank so that choir monies need not now be in his possession over each week-end. This step met with full approval by the committee. Chairman mentioned a quote he had taken for insurance of the Treasurer while money belonging to the choir was in transit. He quoted the necessary costs of premium etc. and allowed discussion on the point. Treasurer stated that he felt such a step would not be necessary, so no further action was taken on this topic. Treasurer was thenked for his report which was accepted unanimously.

SOCIAL SECRETARY'S REPORT: In the unavoidable absence of the Social Sec it was agreed that this topic be placed on the agenda for the next committee meeting, with no further discussion taking place at this meeting.

- ANNUAL CELEBRITY CONCERT (Saturday, May 15th, 1982.) The following datailed points were discussed regarding this concert and the following decisions were taken....
 - Admission Prices: Agreed that there be a standard charge for admission to the concert at £1.00p
 - 2. Tickets/Programmes/Posters: Agreed that tickets be sold for the concert, Sec to arrange for the printing of 500 concert tickets. Agreed that a programme be duplicated and distributed free to the addience. Sec to see to the production of the duplicator skins. Mr. Sanderson agreed to see to the actual duplicating of the same. Agreed that 50
 - crown posters be printed advertising the concert. Sec to see to the printing of the same.

 3. Invitations to V.T.P Guests: Agreed that complimentary tickets be sent to the following guests.... Mayor and Mayoress of Borough of Sunderland, Chairman of Hetton Town

 Council and Lady, Chairman of Durham County Council and Lady, Chairman of Elemore Comm Ass
 and Lady, County Coun and Mrs. 3. Steel, Mrs. Bousfield, Mrs Ritson, Mrs Sharp.
 - 4. Rehearsal Arrangements: Agreed that the chair rehearse in the Church on the Friday evening before the performance, and again from 2:30pm on the afternoon of the performance.
 - 5. Mr. Tom Ritson: Agreed that choir ask Mr. Ritson to play the necessary organ accompaniments. Mus. Dir to liase on this matter with Mr. Ritson.
 - 6. Hoquets of Flowers: Agreed that a boquet of flowers be presented to Nancy Gibson at the end of the concert. Presentation to be by the President. Agreed also that a boquet be presented to Aiss Franks. No decision taken on presenter. Treas to see to the purchase of flowers.
 - 7. Sale of Tickets: Discussion took place on ticket sales and suggestions about how best to maximise on thems. Agreed that people und mant tickets be given these to sell but Chairman to stress the need to push and sell tickets to all choir members when they

are available.

- 8. Assembly for the Concert: Agreed that the choir ass emble in back vestry of church with artistes in Lady Chapel.
- 9. Plano and Staging; Agreed to call upon services of Mr Bowey to provide these and see to transport thereof from Metton Primary School. Chairman agreed to arrange this with Mr. Bowey.

BLACKPOOL FESTIVAL 1982: Sec informed committee of his letters that had been sent to the Festival committee and of his attempts to secure accommodation for the festival. He was able to confirm the date of the choral competition as Saturday October 23rd,1982, though, at time of meeting no information was available on test pieces etc. He gave as accurate an outline of possible costs as he could, mentioning the fact that subsidy from choir funds was not likely this year in view of the German Exchangevisit. Some discussion took place though the concensus was that until such time as the test piece was published, no real progress could be made on this matter. Further discussion was therefore left until such time as more information was to hand.

ACCEPTANCE OF NEW MEMBERS: Agreed that Harry Pescock (Tenor II) be accepted forthwith into full choir membership. It was reported that Mr. Dewhirst(Tenor II) may have to leave the choir during his probationary period, owing to difficuties being experienced in attending rehearnels on a regular basis. Mus. Dir reported that he had made approaches to Mr. Harry bumaker and Mr. Bobby Blackwell to joing the choir. The former had agreed to do so, and it was hoped that the latter would also join.

GRANT FROM TYNE AND WEAR CO. COUNCIL: Sec reported that he had not yet written the letter of application to Tyne and Wear Council for grant aid for 1982, though he would do so withing the next month. He further reported that Hetton Town Council had granted the choir the sum of £150.00p for 1982, this would be presented at a future rehearsal.

GERMAN EXCHANGE VISIT: The following points were conveyed by Chiarman and Mr Middlemas from a recent Tour Gub-Committee meeting.....

- 1. Chair was now in possession of written confirmation of Ferry Bookings.
- Total cost of £55.00p was quoted as being calculated as near as possible to the likely final figure this being based on coach hire, Ferry Passage, and Basic Insurance.
- 3. Group Liability Insurance to be taken for the party, with cover of up to £250,000.00p at a premium cost of £1.90p.
- 4. Agreed after some discussion that memento plates be purchased to be given to Mayor of Sunderland, Chairman of Durham Co. Council and Chairman of Hetton Town Council.
- 5. Established that any grants forhtcoming from Durham Co. Council will only be paid retrospectively, therfore choir funds would have to be used to provide any bridging finance until such time as the grant were paid.
- . In order to help the cash flow problem associated with the arrangements for this trip, it was agreed to ask each person going on this trip to contribute another £10.00p to the funds by two weeks time from the next rehearsal.
- 7. It was revealed that Durham County Council are now to provide only 1 plaque, and that any other commemorative articles to be taken must be purchased by the choir itself, these having already been decided on prints from Mr. David Henshau.
- 8. It was re-affirmed that members going on the trip and who have not been in the 200 club for 2 years will be subsidised in proportion to the amount of time they have been in full 200 club membership.
- 9. It was reported that Mrs. Balmer had expressed her willingness to talk to the party going on the trip about German life, customs etc, and to caoch members in basic German phrases etc if they so wished. Whilst it was agreed that such a meeting would
- be both useful and desirable, it was also agreed that it should take place outside rehearsal time, probably on a 'one-off'basis on a Sunday afternoon, the suggested date being Dednesday, May 19th, 1982, at Elemore Comm Ass'n.

A.D.B. FOR COMMITTEE CONSIDERATION FROM A.G.M: Agreed that in reality points 1 and 2 from the list prepared by Sec, and concerning the development of the Patrons List, had actually been dealt with during the A.G.M. itself, and further discussion was un-necessary. On point 4 concerning the possible future charge for the choir magazine, it was felt that, in view of the large increase in Subs, that the magazine should remain as a free service to magnetis, patrons and friends of the Lyons.

Discussion took place on point 6 concerning the suggestion that the choir advertise in the local press for new recruits. It was felt that on past experience this had proved a

fruitless exercise. It was agreed that the best way to recruit new members was to appeal to people at the end of each concert to come and join the choir. It was agreed to place points 11,12 and 13, all concerning the appointment of a deputy conductor on the agenda for the March Coomittee meeting.

CONFIRMATION OF CONCERT BOOKINGS FOR 1982: See read out the details as far as he knew them of the content of the confirmation commitments so far for 1982. Chairman agreed to relay these to the choir corporate at the next rehearsal. Mus. Dir asked committee if it would be fessible to rehearse on the Wednesday night of Holy Week as an alternative to missing a rehearsal on Good Friday, in the context of the fact that Herr Heinz Druen, an officer of the German Choir would be in Seaham at that time and might possibly like to come over and pay us a visit. Agreed that this should happen if the hall could be booked for that night. See agreed to contact Mrs. Grey to find this out. Mus Dir also asked for the topic of 'General Bolicy Towards Mixed Performances' to be placed on the agenda for the March Committee meeting.

SAINSBURY'S NATIONAL FESTIVAL OF CHOIRS: Sec reported that he had been sent details of this festival and booking forms plus details of a fairly cheap rail package and hotel deal for this festival. Agreed that Chairman relay details to choir members and see if there was any response to this.

YENUE OF FUTURE COMMITTEE MEETINGS: Sec reported that Mr. Hall had established via Mrs. rey that the library room at Elemore would probably be available on the nights we would require it for committee meetings at a cost of £2.00p per night (7:00pm till 10:00pm). Discussion took place on this topic and it was finally agreed to maintain the status quo and continue to meet in committee member's homes. Sec was instructed to make enquiries into the possibility of having a choir notice board placed in the Hall at Elemore.

LYONS MALE VOICE CHOIR. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING AT 7:00pm; ON JANUARY 30th, 1982; AT THE ELEMORE COMMUNITY CENTRE, EASINGTON LANE.

The meeting was opened by the President who gave a short address of welcome. He thanked the members for turning out to the A.G.M. in such numbers, considering the state of the night. He wished the chair well and expressed the hope that it's fortunes would continue to flourish during 1982 as they had done in 1981. The President was thanked for his remarks and for his work on behalf of the chair by the Chairman.

APOLOGIES FOR NESENCE: Secretary reported that there had been no written apologies for absence received, but verbal apologies were received at the start of the meeting.

MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING: usre duly read, approved and signed.

matters arising from the minutes: The Chairman reported that the only business still outstanding from the previous A₂G₂M₃, was the appointment of the Deputy Conductor for the chair. He gave a brief outline of the committee deliberations thus far on this matter, the ideas discussed etc. and promised that this matter would be cleared up as soon as could be arranged. All the other matters for Committee consideration from the previous 4.G₂M₃, had been discussed in convictee at various meetings during the past year, and the choir had been informed of any decisions/recommendations taxed on those individual points.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The Treasurer presented the balance sheet for the previous year(copies of which were evallable to members. He explained various points concerning the finances of the choir, and invited questions from individual members, which were duly presented ad enswered. The Chairman therked the Treasurer for the esticulous way in which he kept the finances of the choir. The Treasurer's report and the balance sheet were unanimously appeared.

AUDITORS' REPORT: MR. Coede, speaking on behalf of himself and Mr. Cook, reported that all the choir account books atd had been duly examined by the Auditors and found correct. He commented on the difficulty of the Transurer's work and the commendable and efficient matter in which he executed his tasks.

ROLL SECRETARY'S REPORT: The Roll Secretary reported that he had duly kept the choir register as faithfully as he could, though often in somewhat trying circumstances, he gave datails of the best and worst attendences within the various sections of the choir during the previous year. He also ande comment on the continuing difficulties of the retrieval of music from members, hence his recently adopted policy of deliberately taking individual members8 music cases from them and extracting the various copies of music that were being recalled at the time.

SICK VISITORS REPORT: Mr. Huitean reported that all the members who had been reported to himself and Mr. Simpson as sick, had been duly visited during the year; but made the asseration that the sick visitors could only do their job efficiently if they were informed via other charisters, when chair members were iil. Chairman thanked the sick visitors for their work on behalf of the chair. Their report was accepted.

MUSICAL DIRECTORS REMARKS: Physical Director preferred his remarks by emphasising the robisms of library management faced by the choir, sepacially when copies of music seem to "mysteriously" disappear. The choir always bought more copies of a piece of music than the total membership of the choir, and yet, there had been several occasions in the past year when members had continued by stating that the past year had been a good year musically, when both our membership and our musical standards had risen, he stated his disappointment concerning the unfortunate draw, timings at about Llangollon, yet he felt that we should all have learned, musically, from the experiences he offered sincers thanks to Are. Gibson, for her starling work as choir accompanist during the year, often under difficult circumstances at contain concert venues. He looked forward to a busy and successful 1932, perhaps highlighted by the Germen Exchange Visit, but also to the possibility of competing at Biackpool Festival, and to a full programme of concerts. Musical Director was thanked by the Chairman for his effort and dedication plus his patience with his charieters.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: See reported another busy year of choir business and administration, and paid tribute to the help received during the year from the Assistant Sec and Treesurer. He stated that since the last AGM, committee had met it times on its elloted night and on at least as many occasions again(usually after reheareals) to deal with matters of increased urgancy. He apologised to members that, since the move to the new reheareal venue, there had been senething of a breakdown in the visual communications policy that had worked well

grough in the former vanue. Until this situation could be remedied, the onue of communication would have to fall back onto Chairman's announcements. See thanked the committee and members for putting up with his mistakes in the year past.

CHOIRMAN'S REMARKS: Retiring Cheiroan expressed the hope that he had served the choir in the two years part with both honour and dignity. He felt that the reputation of the choir had been cohenced and it's musical standards eplifted in the telented hands of the Musical Director. He expressed his standards thanks to the editors and contributors to the Choir Magazine; also to the consistes marbers and chuir officials for their hard work and opdication in running the affeirs of the choir. He wished the Chairman elect a happy and successful period of office.

The "Incoming" Chairman thanked for Bousy for his service to the choir through what had been a period of hard work administratively. He made special reference to the tireless work that the retiring chairman had put in to get the exchange visit off the ground and re-iterated that he had indeed served the choir with honour and dignity. In this came spirit, he embarked on his term of office with equally high hopes for the musical success of the choir:

SUBSCRIPTIONS FOR 1982: The Chairman outlined to mambers the discussions that had taken where in committee on this topic. He stated that committee had recommended that subs for 82 be increased to E3.00p for full membership and £1.50p for student/0.4.P. membership, but that it had been agreed in committee that this topic be open for discussion at this meeting. After due discussion it was agreed that subscriptions for 1982 be £5.00p for full membership and £2.00p for student/0.4.P. membership.

PATRONS FEES: Chairman again informed the mosting of committee concern over the state of the Patrons list and offered the committee recommendation that for 1982 the fues be reduced to £3.00p (double petron) and £1.00p (single Patron). See was to prepare forms for patrons and distribute these to mambers who were asked to seriously recruit new patrons for the chair and thus build up the patrons list.

A.O.B. FOR COMMITTEE CONSIDERATION: Individual choir members asked committee to consider several points and suggestions concerning the patrons list, committee was asked to consider making a small charge for the choir megazine. Spural members offered ideas and possible resonant for the resolution of the problem of the appointment of a Deputy Conductor for the choir. Points were made and taken concerning ways of recruiting membership to the choir through the possible use of the press and other media organizations.

MINUTES OF COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY, JANUARY 28th, 1982; AT 7:00pm; AT 4, BELMONT

RISE, HETTON-LE-HOLE. (Home of Mr. and Mrs. S. Bowey.)

CHAIRMAN: Mr. S. Bowey.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Messr's Curtis, Hall, Huggins, Kay, Lamb, Middlemas, Settrey, Williams and Young.

APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE: were received from Fr. H. Bousfield.

MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING: were duly read approved and signed.

MATTERS ARISING: Several matters arose as follows:-

Sec confirmed to committee that the entry of the choir to the competition at Ryton, had been officially withdrawn and that the entry fee of £4.00p had been duly returned.
 Sec confirmed the dates of concerts in 1982 with committee members as far as could be at the time of the meeting.

3. Questions were asked concerning the finances of the Messiah performance. It was agreed that the loss incurred would reveal itself in the 1981 Balance sheet to be presented in "the Treesurer's Report, and would be discussed in that context.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The Treasurer reported first on the current financial state of the choir, with receipts to date being some £1806.02p set against expenditure to date of £11.16p leaving a current balance of £1794.86p. Monies held as follows...Current A/C... <718.75p and Deposit A/C... £1876.11p. He then presented the 1981 balance sheet and</p> ent through this Item by Item, explaining the various gains and losses of the year past. Treasurer pointed out that receipts of £298.01p from the City Hall Concert hed errived but too late to be included on the 1981 Balance sheet. Mention was sade of the fact that Len Parker (deceased) had bought and paid for choir trousers which would not have been worn, and suggested that we contact the widow with a view to buying these back from her. though no firm decision was taken on this suggestion. Treasurer went on to inform committ es, that the subscription to the Elemore Community Association was due, and pointed out that, in the past we have also made a donation towards the community Asa'n funds of £25. Discussion took place on whether to continue the payment of a donation. Mr. Curtis auguested that we do them a concert free of charge in lieu of donation, though this suggestion was not taken up. Mr. Lamb moved that since we are now donating to the funds by using the premises, that we cease to give this donation. Mr. Huggins moved that we keep the donation going to the Community Association and this remain at £25.00p. Both motions were seconded. and Mr. Hugginamotion was carried. Questions were asked of the Treasurer as to the payment of monies to travel egents for travel costs for Germany, and the Treasurer was of the opinion that if individual members did not meet the deadline payment dates with their 5 payments the choir funds would be able to provide the 'bridging finance'. Lengthy discision took place on the financial losses of the Messiah Perfomance and the near loss of who 1981 Annual Concert as shown on the balance sheet. In this Mr. Curtis sounded a cautionary note as to the booking of artistes in future at large fees. The Treasufer summed up this discussion by stating his considered opinion that the crux of the whole matter was the fact that the choir members were not motivating themselves to get out and sell tickets to secole, evidence for which was the stated fact that only 20 choir members sold tickets for the Messian Performance out of a total membership of 65. The Treasurer's report and the 1991 Salance Sheet were accepted unanimously.

SDCIAL SECRETARY's REPORT: Social Sec reported that the first part of the year is not very active socially due to such things as the weather, availability of halls, lack of definite knowledge re- booking of concerts etc. He did state that he had received some good ideas for social events from the magazine. He reported that the Masonic Hall > < in Hetton is booked for a social evening on Saturday Sept. 18th1982, and he suggested that instead of a set meal, this year we have soup, a good buffet meal and a sweet. This suggest stion met with general approval but was not formally accepted. Mus. Dir. suggested a "send-off" function prior to the German Visit, suggesting the Elemore Comm. Ass'n Hall as a possible venue for this function. Soc. Sec agreed to find out prices and availability etc. He also suggested that the choir should sing at it's own social functions in future. Mr. Lamb suggested a social function to honour our President, suggesting Sat May 1st. or Thurs, April 29th as possible dates and either Elemore Comm ASS'n or the Church Hall as possible venues. This suggestion was approved, the Soc Sec being mandated to make enquiries as to availability of Malls, prices etc. There was also a feeling expressed among committee for a 'men only' social gathering. Mr. Curtis suggested a Darts and Dominoes Smoker, a' possible venue for which being the Colden Lion at South Hylton. No formal appreval was given to this suggestion thoough Mr. Curtis offered to organise such an evening when the chair wished to make this suggestion official.

MATTERS PERTAINING TO THE A.G.M.: Several matters were discussed as follows:-

1. Subscriptions for 1982: Discussion took place around making a recommendation to the A.G.M. on the subscription s for 1981. There was concensus opinion that the subscriptions would have to be raised, the point being made that, at our present rate of subscription we get hyper cheap enjoyment. It was proposed and seconded that committee recommend that for 1982, choir subscriptions be raised to £3.00p for full membership and £1.50p for 0.A.p. membership and students who are not earning a wage. Mr. Lamb proposed that the committee recommend that subscriptions be raised, but to leave the settling of the exact amount to the membership at the £.G.M., on the basis that the committee might very well be curprised at the value of the choir placed on it by it's membership. It was agreed that the recommendation of the stipulated amounts be put to the A.G.M. but that mention be made of the discussion, and leave it to the membership to decide.

2. Committee Members: Chairman expressed the sincere thanks of the choir officers to the two retiring committee members, Mr. Curtis and Mr. Lamb, for the sincere and sterling sork they had put in on behalf of the members they were elected to represent, dusing their two year term of office. It was established that two more committee members should be ...

elected at the A.G.M.

3. A.O.B. for Committee Consideration: Mr Lamb expressed his objections of principle that if an A.O.B. item is to be included on the agenda, then this should be without the proviso of "committee consideration". Some discussion took place theough it was fieldly agreed to maintain the current wording of this item on the agenda.

4. Sec asked permission to have a new supply of letterheads, duly amended and printed

after the A.G.M. This permission was granted.

WENUE OF FUTURE COMMITTEE MEETINGS: Mus Dir re-iterated his thoughts that a central meeting place for committee outside members homes might be in the best interests of both committee time and choir efficiency. Mr. Lamb voiced objection to this from the view point of the Sunderland based committee members, and other living well outside the Metton erea, who at least got one committee meeting night at their home base under the present system. Mr. Middleman schoed these views. No decision was taken at this meeting though Sec and Soc Sec were instructed to enquire as to availability and costs of booking a room in the Eelemore Comm Ass'n and the Church Hall for such meetings.

GERMAN EXCHANGE VISIT: Several points were discussed as follows:-

1. Mementoes: Tour her reported on the costs of the illuminated plate suggestion from the Gladstone Pottery Museum. Discussion took place on both the costs and the need to place and order for these as soon as possible. It was agreed that as soon as the specimen plate becomes available it be shown to the chair members and prospective orders taken as soon as possible thereafter.

 Travel Arrangements: Four Sec reported that the Ferry Company had not yet confirmed the booking of the ferry crossings, but the travel agents were endeavouring to secure this.

confirmation as soon as possible.

- 3. Composition of the party: Tour Sec reported the people who had dropped out of the trip, and suggested that the choir should be informed that spare palces were available should any members now wish to make the trip. The possible prob 1 m of probationary choir members wishing to go was discussed though no firm conditions for acceptance of such cases was acreed.
- 4. Deposits: People who had not yet paid deposits were listed in committee, these members to be reminded through a choir notice that their deposits are due in respect of their commitment to this trip. Lengthy discussion took place as to whether the deposits should be refunded to the people who have dropped out of the tour. Committee opinion was much divided on this topic, some members felt that it should be a non returnable deposit, though the case of Len Parker lessened the weight of this argument, it being finally agreed that deposits would only be refunded at a time when it is not going to incer any financial loss to the choir.
