HETTON SOLDIER WINS MILITARY MEDAL.

Mrs Margaret Bond, of 24, The Avenue, has been informed that her son, Michael Bond, of the Tyneside Irish, has been awarded the Military Medal for conspicuous bravery in the big offensive on July 1st. He also had the honour of being promoted from lance-corporal to sergeant on the battlefield. Sergeant Bond before enlisting was a miner at the Eppleton Colliery.
